Style and abbreviations

The major part of the abbreviations follows the instruction for contributors in the *Journal of Biblical Literature* (*JBL* 117(3):560–579).¹ Some abbreviations, not present in *JBL*, follow the system in the *OTP*. Page layout and other elements of style are based on *The Chicago Manual of Style* (CMS 14th ed.) and the ‘author date citation and reference list’ system. If not otherwise noted references to the Bible are from the NIV, the Apocrypha from the RSV, the Pseudepigrapha from the OTP, Qumran texts from the DSSSE, and Philo and Josephus from the LCL. Articles in well-known reference works such as the *TDNT*, *TDOT*, *APOT*, *OTP* and *NIDNTT* are not included in the reference list (*cf.* CMS 15:293, p. 594), but the authors of the articles are usually named in the text.

Chapter 1

Introduction

In Israel's Declaration of Independence it is written: "We trust in the Rock of Israel, we affix our signatures in testimony to this declaration" (May 14, 1948).¹ According to Donin the expression "Rock of Israel" is lifted from the morning prayers of the Jews, which accompanies the *Shema* in the morning service of the Synagogue.² About 1900 years earlier, Paul wrote to the Corinthians: "And that Rock was Christ" (1Cor 10:4). In the morning prayer of the Jews, we find the reference to God's oneness together with the description of God as the Rock of Israel. In a similar way, we find the description of God's oneness together with the description of Christ as the Rock in First Corinthians (8:4, 6; 10:4). The combination of 1Cor 10:4 and Israel's Declaration of Independence gives an interpretation of the term 'rock' which the founders of the State of Israel would find repulsive. The devout Christian, however, would sense a prophetic spirit behind such a combination. It may be argued that both texts have roots in the OT (Isaiah 30:29; cf. Deut 32:4). Which is the right interpretation of the phrase 'the Rock of Israel'? To answer such a question one would have to identify a culture-specific context, the cultural context of those involved in the act of communication. This example shows the fundamental difference in meaning which might be attached to a phrase in different cultures and the tremendous power of dominant texts.

The person of Christ is the focus of religious controversy in many cultures, not only in present day Israel but also in many Muslim countries. During my ministry at a theological seminary in Java, I witnessed the theological struggle that my students went through. One of their questions was, 'How can I describe Christ in a way that is not repulsive to my Muslim friends?' It led to a tremendous intellectual struggle with the biblical texts, a struggle resembling the Christological debates in the early church, bordering on Adoptianism and Modalism. Their struggle led me on to the is-

sue pursued in this study, the relationship between monotheism and Christology in Pauline theology.³

At the outset, the plan was to make a comparative study focusing on the Indonesian Christians ‘squeezed’ between Muslim monotheism and Javanese monism, as compared to the early church and its relationship with Jewish monotheism and Hellenistic philosophy. However, along the road, the two parts of the dissertation drifted apart; thus, in this volume, only the New Testament issue is left. Despite enticing parallels, the Indonesian part of the project has been and will be published elsewhere.⁴ This has led to a New Testament project with a focus on the culturally conditioned meaning of 1Cor 8:1–6. It is my hypothesis that there are profound links between 1Cor 8:1–6 and the *Shema*. Initially it was the phrases “one God” and “one Lord” that led some scholars to assume that 1Cor 8:4b and/or 8:6 are dependent on the *Shema*. Once this is established, a series of questions arise: How did the Jews use the *Shema*? To what degree does the literary context of 1Cor 8:4b and 8:6 support the theory that Paul is reinterpreting the *Shema*? How is Paul changing Jewish theology by applying the *Shema* to Jesus? What is the relationship between God and Jesus in such a double use of the *Shema*? The importance of this discussion is underlined by four circumstances that are vital to the argument of this study: 1) the *Shema* is a *strong pretext*, committed to memory and used in daily prayer and other rituals. 2) The belief that the Lord is one, as described in the *Shema*, was a *core value* in first century Jewish religion. 3) The use of the *Shema* and the First Commandment made the belief in one God an *explicit core value*. 4) Belief in one God, as described in the *Shema*, was a *boundary marker* that distinguishes Jews from non-Jews.

Initially the task was limited to the interpretation of 1Cor 8:1–6 in light of the *Shema* (Deut 6:4–5). We chose to focus on this issue for two reasons: 1) the parallels between 1Cor 8:6 and the *Shema* are well known, but a thorough investigation of the nature of the relationship is still wanting. 2) The vast task ahead clearly needed to be limited to a certain field of study. However, there seems to be a close connection between the *Shema* and the first two Commandments (Deut 5:7–10) in Deuteronomy, as well as in

Jewish thought.⁵ Such a combination might also be seen behind two statements in 1Cor 8:4 saying that “there is no idol in the world” (my trans. cf. Deut 5:8) and “there is no God but one” (my trans.; cf. Deut 5:7). Thus a discussion of the intertextual relationship between the *Shema* and 1Cor 8:1–6 cannot avoid the question of the First Commandment. Even the Second Commandment might be of relevance in this context. Chapter 2

History of Research and Methodology

It has been argued that 1Cor 8:1–6 is the earliest NT text testifying to the pre-existence of Christ and His participation in the act of creation.¹ Hahn calls it “The oldest confessional text.”² This text contains reference to themes like knowledge, love, creation, salvation, Christology, idolatry, food sacrificed to idols and monotheism. We have chosen to focus on the relationship between the Christology in 1Cor 8:1–6 and testimonies to the oneness of God in Deuteronomy, primarily the *Shema* and the First Commandment. Due to the phrase “one Lord Jesus Christ” and the apparent parallel between 1Cor 8:6 and the *Shema*, this verse deserves special attention in the discussion:³

... yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live, and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came, and through whom we live (1Cor 8:6).

Several authors have found analogies to this verse in Greek philosophy (*e.g.* Stoicism). Some have seen the correlation between this passage and the Jewish confession, the *Shema*. However, few have elaborated on the latter observation. The discussion of the relationship between Deut 6:4–5 and 1Cor 8:1–6 will be dealt with elsewhere. At this stage, it is necessary to explore the nature of the problem. It may be argued that there is an intertextual relationship between these texts, meaning that the latter interacts with the former in the discursive space formed by first century Jewish culture.

2.1 Johannes Weiß

The modern discussion of the background of 1Cor 8:1–6 was initiated by Johannes Weiß.⁴ He found a double monotheistic statement in 1Cor 8:4, a positive confession to God's oneness and a negative phrase akin to the First Commandment. He identified parallels between 1Cor 8:4, Mark 12:29–32 and Deut 4:35. He further associates 1Cor 8:4 with Deut 5:7, 6:4–5 and *m. Ber.* 1:1–4.⁵ Apparently, Weiß confines these intertextual links to the relationship between 1Cor 8:4 and its pretexts, isolating 1Cor 8:6 from its innertextual context.⁶ Weiß focuses on the Hellenistic influence in his discussion of 1Cor 8:5–6, interpreting the term κύριοι with reference to the emperor cult or local deities. The description of Christ is seen as a fusion of the Jewish (Palestinian and Hellenistic) concept σοφία, the λόγος concept of Stoic pantheism and the γνώσις concept of Egyptian Hellenism, possibly transmitted through Philo. Weiß finds it difficult to understand the process that led these half-personal beings to be identified with Jesus. He ends up with two worldviews in 1Cor 8–10: 1) an antique, possibly Jewish view, identifying idols with demons and prohibiting any contact with any form of food sacrificed to idols (1Cor 10:20ff). 2) A Gnostic view (1Cor 8:1, 4), describing idols as nothingness and allowing participation in temple meals. Thus he finds a contrast between Paul's indifference to - and demonization of idols.⁷

2.2 Bousset, Norden and Peterson

Many modern commentators find the following so-called ‘formulas’ behind 1Cor 8:6:

- 1) κύριος Ἰησοῦς
- 2) ἐξ σοῦ πάντα, ἐν σοὶ πάντα, εἰς σὲ πάντα.
- 3) εἰς θεός

Despite some variation, similar phrases are found in various parts of the letters attributed to Paul, together or apart; however, there is no undisputed

consensus about their background. Despite this, some general trends may be detected. Three monographs, written at the beginning of the twentieth century, set the agenda for the modern discussion.⁸ None of these focused on 1Cor 8:6, but rather on the genetic development of the so-called formulas.⁹

2.2.1 *Kyrios Christos*

Bousset's contribution to our topic is his discussion of the phrase: κύριος χριστός.¹⁰ He claims that Paul initiated the use of the term κύριος about Christ. Bousset based his discussion on a division of the early church into a Palestinian *Urgemeinde* and a Hellenistic church.¹¹ He holds the twin confession of God the Father and the Lord Jesus (1Cor 8:6) to be 'thinkable' only in a cultural context without a firm monotheistic basis, namely the Hellenistic church.¹² This conclusion is based on the alleged absence of the divine title 'Lord' in Hebrew and Aramaic parts of Jewish literature and its use in Hellenistic mystery religions and emperor cults.¹³ Bousset found a basic distinction between the vocative κύριε, used as a polite address in early gospel tradition and the title ὁ κύριος. He denies that the title was taken from the LXX and adapted to Jesus. Arguing for a non-theological origin of the term κύριε, he argues that the phrase Χριστὸς κύριος, found in Luke and possibly adapted from an Aramaic source, may have been a mistranslation of 'Yahweh's Messiah'. He further claimed that

the phrase μαράνα θά (1Cor 16:22, cf. Rev. 22:20) originated in the bilingual church in Antioch.¹⁴

Bousset gives evidence for the use of the κύριος title from Egyptian, Syrian and Gnostic religion, and regards Paul's comparison of God with many gods and lords in 1Cor 8:5 as proof for a Hellenistic origin of the confession of Jesus as Lord. Whilst comparing the titles 'god' and 'lord' to each other in the gentile cults, he admits that they were given to the gods in the centre of each cult.¹⁵ According to Bousset, Paul did not believe that Jesus was God, but rather a mediator who depended on God as the church depended on Him (1Cor 3:22–23).¹⁶ Bousset admits that belief in one God was essential in Diaspora Judaism and he denies that 1Cor 8:5–6 was an expansion of the angelic figures described in Jewish literature: "Es handelt sich eben hüben und drüben um eine gewisse Erweichung und Verschleierung des alttestamentlichen Monotheismus."¹⁷ Thus, he described Jesus as 'Halbgott'.¹⁸

Despite his strong emphasis on the gentile origin of the κύριος title, Bousset admits that Paul uses OT quotations about 'Jesus', where the Hebrew original reads 'Yahweh'. He sees this as a natural development, after the title κύριος had been fixed to Jesus. However, Bousset still claims that Paul made a difference between the words θεός and κύριος, thus underlining the difference between the Father and Jesus.¹⁹ Even though he regards the title ὁ κύριος to be a fruit of the cult and praxis of the early church, he admits that Paul could find it anywhere in the LXX.

It is significant that Bousset calls 1Cor 8:6 a 'confession', even though he describes the phrase κύριος Ἰησοῦς as a cultic or ecstatic outcry, the background of which is sought in exorcisms as described in the gospel narrative. He describes the name of the Lord as "das gewaltige Kultmittel," arguing that this practice led to the acceptance of Jesus as the cult hero of

the Hellenistic church.²⁰ Thus Bousset separates the original use of the phrase from its use in 1Cor 8:6.

Based on new archaeological evidence, it may be argued that Bousset's treatment of the κύριος title is open to reconsideration.²¹ Secondly, a discussion of its use in 1Cor 8:5–6, as part of a literary analysis of the whole letter, might lead to greater emphasis on its OT background.

2.2.2 *The so-called ‘omnipotence formula’*

The important matter in Norden's ‘*Agnostos Theos*’ is his focus on the so-called ‘omnipotence formula’. It is notable that he focused on form or *Stilgeschichte*.²² He argued that Christian worship and liturgy was dependant on Jewish liturgy, but he found our text to be an exception. In his comments on 1Cor 8:6 and parallels (Rom 11:33ff, Col 1:16f, Eph 4:5f, Heb 2:10), Norden focused on Paul's use of the so-called τὰ πάντα formula. This ‘formula’ he calls a Stoic doxology.²³ He found no OT parallels to the phrase ἐξ ἀντοῦ καὶ δι' αὐτοῦ καὶ εἰς αὐτὸν τὰ πάντα (Rom 11:36). However, he found clear parallels in Hellenistic writings, especially from Stoic pantheism: “Alles was harmonisch ist, o Welt, das ist es auch mir. Nichts kommt mir zu früh oder zu spät, was dir zeitgemäß erscheint. Alles was deine Jahrläufe bringen, ist mir Frucht, o Natur: ἐξ σου πάντα, ἐν σοὶ πάντα, εἰς σὲ πάντα” (Marcus Aurelius).²⁴ Norden claims that Paul's use of the preposition διά is closer to the original Stoic usage.²⁵ He finds the same so-called formula from *die Vorsokratikern* to second century A.D. Christianity, arguing that the original was a threefold formula, which at times was reduced to a double formula (1Cor 8:6).²⁶ Norden admits that the combination of the so-called ‘omnipotence formula’ and monotheism is

Jewish but he finds proof for the combination of the τὰ πάντα phrase and confessions to the oneness of ‘the all’ in the early Greek philosophers like Heraclitus, in a form of pantheism or monism describable by the phrase: “unum esse omnia.”²⁷ Most of his examples use the term μόνος, sometimes in combination with εῖς. Through Hellenistic Judaism, Norden links the Greek use of the τὰ πάντα phrase with the Christian. He underlines the linguistic parallel between the Sibylline ὄρων μόνος αὐτὸς ἀπαντα (*Sib. Or.* 5:11f [*sic.*, probably 3:11f]) and, as he says: “der Zeusenkomion des Aristeides angeführten αὐτὸς ἀν μόνος (εἰπών) und τέλειον μόνον αὐτὸν ὅντα τῶν πάντων.”²⁸ He concludes that the so-called Stoic “τὰ πάντα Formula” was a syncretistic element in Paul’s letters.²⁹ However, the implications of this conclusion for the interpretation of 1Cor 8:6 are more or less left to the readers of his monograph.

2.2.3 Peterson

Peterson’s book “ΕΙΣ ΘΕΟΣ” is the latest and for our issue the most important of these three monographs. It is partly dependent on its predecessors.³⁰ Peterson’s discussion of the phrase εῖς θεός is first and foremost an investigation of Christian epigraphic literature and liturgy. Hence most of his material is late.³¹ Despite his division of liturgies into acclamations, confessions and exorcisms, his focus is on acclamations.³² The methodology has much in common with the *religionsgeschichtliche Methode*.³³ Additionally the issue of *form* plays an important part in his discussion of the ‘one God’ phrase.³⁴

2.2.3.1 The Content of ΕΙΣ ΘΕΟΣ

To begin with, Peterson describes the occurrences of the ‘one God’ formula on graves and houses, at times over entrances, on amulets and other small artefacts like seals and rings. He argues that this has to do with the

protective use of the formula.³⁵ He fails to ask whether there is a relationship between amulets and phylacteries, or between house inscriptions and *mezuzot*. The material presented by Peterson includes many texts with combined reference to Father, Son and Holy Spirit.³⁶ The combination of ‘εἰς θεός’ and ‘μόνος ...’ is quite common in his material.³⁷

The second and third part of the monograph underlines Peterson's emphasis on formcriticism. He argues that the εἰς θεός acclamation was imported from paganism to Judaism,³⁸ thus being incorporated into Jewish- and Christian liturgy, but still in the form of acclamations. An acclamation is defined as an enthusiastic cry of a multitude, sometimes with legal implications; hence, it was often written down. Peterson describes such acclamations as expressions of *consensus populi*.³⁹ He maintains that it was such relatively spontaneous acclamations, rather than Jewish confessions of the oneness of the Lord, that influenced Christian liturgy.⁴⁰ However, with reference to ecumenical councils he speaks of prepared acclamations (or confessions), playing down the difference.⁴¹ This concession gets little attention in his discussion, as his main emphasis is on the spontaneous and ecstatic elements; but many of the texts he reviewed were formulaic rather than spontaneous.⁴²

In the following parts, Peterson argues that the acclamations are closely connected with an instant reaction to a miracle. However, many of his examples to this effect are martyr stories. This is interesting, as the Jewish use of the *Shema* in martyr stories is well known.⁴³ Peterson admits that
